AKWA IBOM STATE CHAPTER PROMOTES PEACE AND ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT IN ITIAM AND MBIABONG COMMUNITIES

The Akwa Ibom State Chapter of Partners for Peace in the Niger Delta (P4P) took a bold step toward strengthening interfaith harmony and community resilience. In collaboration with the Cardinal Onaiyekan Foundation for Peace, they organized a one-day workshop in the Itiam and Mbiabong communities titled "Fostering Peaceful Coexistence: Building Bridges Between Faiths for a Stronger Community."

The event brought together religious leaders, community stakeholders, and peace advocates to strengthen interfaith dialogue and promote peaceful coexistence.

Beyond the discussions, the chapter addressed economic empowerment as a pathway to sustainable peace. Vulnerable community members in Itiam and Mbiabong received sewing machines, wheelbarrows, and grinding engines to support their livelihoods and reduce economic vulnerability, a key factors in community stability.

By combining dialogue with direct support, the Akwa Ibom State Chapter is turning peacebuilding into action.

Abia Peace Clubs Use Sports and Advocacy to **Drive Positive Change.**

In February, the Abia State Chapter Peace Clubs took bold steps to promote health, fitness, and social change through community engagement.

The Peace Club of Girls' Secondary School, Uzuakoli, organized a road walk for fitness and HIV/AIDS awareness, using sports as a tool to educate and empower their peers. They also paid an advocacy visit to HRH Eze Okezie Chijioke, the Traditional Ruler of Eluoma Autonomous Community, seeking support for peace and health initiatives.

Similarly, the Peace Club of Uzuakoli Boys' Secondary School led a road walk themed "Sports Against Anti-Social Activities." Their initiative aimed to steer young people away from negative influences through sports. They partnered with Hon. Emmanuel Chinedu Ndubuisi (Ijiriji Bende), Member Representing Bende South State Constituency, to amplify their message and inspire action.

The Bende Subchapter of Abia P4P is making a difference where it matters most community health. Led by Amb. Peter Chijioke Azubuike, the team carried out a series of health-focused advocacy campaigns at the Primary Health Centre (PHC), focusing strongly on malaria and HIV/AIDS awareness.

Their efforts led to a tangible impact where community members received free malaria testing and medications, ensuring that those in need got access to essential healthcare. By addressing health challenges, the Bende Subchapter is reinforcing the link between public health and peace, proving that a healthy community is a stronger, more peaceful one.
